LEADERSHIP TEAM MINUTES

United Covenant Church Clear Lake, WI 2026 Semi-Annual Meeting.

Call to Order. Lucas called the meeting to order at 11:29 a.m. on July 19, 2026. 38 people were present.

Opening Scripture and Prayer by Nate Cundiff. 1 Cor 12:12 Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. ¹⁴Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.

Secretary Report. A few minutes were provided to review the Annual Meeting Minutes from January 2026. Matt Elsmore motioned to accept as written. Tim Jurisch seconded. Motion passed with no objections.

Youth Report by Josh Williamson. What a blessing and privilege it is to be involved with our youth. Something we just recently started—we have a youth Sunday for service every month that there is a 5th Sunday to give them an opportunity to be a part of the church in that way. Thank you for encouraging that. Next summer the Covenant has the UNITE conference in Lincoln NE—5 days with music and speakers next summer. We will be doing fund raisers for that. Thank you for trusting me. Thank you to our youth leaders for everything they do.

Financial Report. A few minutes were provided to review. Lucas explained the document to help it be understood—he explained each column. He explained that some things are a high percentage because we pay them annually. Lucas shared that when people are excited they are going to do 3 things: give of time, talk about it and give financially; and, so I was really encouraged with this weeks leadership team (LT) meeting as we are \$6K to the good YTD in our budget 'cause its really hard to make the budget because we are “guessing” what the giving is going to be even though we know the expenses. The first few months of this year we were a little behind but over the last couple of months we have really seen faithfulness. Remember this includes the \$8K that we are paying ourselves for future growth. Thank you so much. Drew inquired regarding benevolence as to whether there is a protocol if someone in the church sees a need? Do we just go to Pastor Dan? Answer: Yes, go through Pastor Dan. If there are larger asks Pastor Dan will bring to the LT. Tim Jurisch motioned to accept as written. Jim Mohrland seconded. Motion passed with no objections. Lucas shared who is on the LT team.

Janet Marlett asked how the cleaning is going. Answer: we have hired professional service that for the summer comes every 4 weeks and the weeks in between is a volunteer spreadsheet. It is going okay but most things are being done by a small amount of people. We were running this as a trial. We don't have enough volunteers—see Erin Carlson if you would like to volunteer as she manages the spreadsheet. We are going to hire the service for every week when ministry season starts.

Missions Highlights by Matt Thayer. We are currently supporting 5 missions. Dan and Jane Howe through CRU intercity in Mpls. Kyle Montgomery in Lebanon Jordan works with youth. Seth and Samantha Jordan in Israel and Palestine area. They are both doing well and continuing ministry. Tim and Wendy Moore in Colorado in Resource Exchange International. KICY radio station in Nome Alaska that broadcasts Christian radio into Russia. One of the tricky things about speaking about our missionaries on Sunday is that 3 of the 5 missionaries we can't speak about due to security/safety reasons. Each organization we give \$100 each month.

Next March 13 to 17, 2027 we are bringing a group to Lake Charles LA. There will probably be one more info meeting in August. Sept. 20 we will need a firm number as to who is going and will be asking for a \$100 deposit. The cap is 30 people. We hope there is more and we would need to do another trip. The area has really been hurt by hurricanes. We will basically go down and say “here we are, what can we do”. We will hand out food, one day at the beach to go “crabbing.” The organization we are going through is Praying Pelicans. They make organizing the trip very easy. We will probably stay in a church on cots. If you are interested, contact me, Matt Thayer. Also thank you LT for allowing the Polk County Fair volunteer service proceeds to go toward the mission trip.

Parsonage Project Update by Tim Jurisch. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered and helped with the project. God is good. We had to redo all the drywall due to cracking from the move—that is almost done. The basement is framed. As soon as the electrical is done we will hang drywall. The driveway will be paved in August. The goal is to have the parsonage project wrapped up by fall. Does anyone have questions? None asked.

Leadership Team Highlights by Lucas.

- 1) We celebrated this spring the graduation of Nate and Josh from the Rural Ministry Degree program. They will be doing their internship here. We are really excited to see what they will do. Nate will be here 5 to 10 hrs. Josh is having his regular work hours as his internship and teaming up with Nate.
- 2) Back in March we had a LT retreat for which we met at Josh and Emily Johnson's house. We shared our personal stories and reviewed a book “Leading through Change.”
- 3) We had the 1613 Men's conference this past weekend. It was incredibly inspiring
- 4) We have vibrant young adult ministries that are happening. We have 2 that are going. One group just went to Valley Fair together. They are incredibly knowledgeable about God. We are grateful that they are digging in and growing
- 5) Thank you for all involved with Hope ALive and Clear Lake Days
- 6) Thank you to all who have helped with cleaning and
- 7) Once the regular youth group concluded the youth group wanted to continue to meet and are meeting every other week during the summer which is really encouraging. We have incredible young people and thank you to Josh and all the youth volunteers.

Old Business by Lucas.

- 1) We continue to evaluate the need for increased staffing. We have talked about hiring a whole other person and other options. We are taking our time to make the right choice and continue to wrestle about that. We would appreciate your prayers for that.
- 2) We continue to work on the security of our building. We have some security cameras. We have a bid in to install some crash bars for emergency egress doors to work on keeping the building safe and secure

Question: when is the church building open during the week?

Answer: most of the time. There are often people here. Monday is the quietest.

New Business by Lucas.

- 1) We have another bid in for the parking lot for repair of some of the rougher areas but we are to the point that we have outlived its lifetime and we are going to probably need to start over soon. It might mesh with the new church building as we circle back to that need. With the repairs it should last another couple of years. Questions? Cindy M. I just want to thank the LT because your monthly reports mean a lot and the notes in the highlight paper mean a lot. We continue to pray for you. Thank you.

We thank you all for coming.

Pastor Comments I was looking at this scripture from Luke 9. When the apostles had returned from casting out demons and stuff was happening. Then they went to Bethsaida and the crowds heard about it. Later the twelve said to Jesus to send them away because we are in a remote place. Here is what the scripture says: ¹²Late in the afternoon the Twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here."¹³ He replied, "You give them something to eat."

Here is the thing—God was moving and all of the sudden there are these people and God was asking them (his disciples) to do something uncomfortable. He had them step out in faith and we need to be praying about what God is calling us to do. I don't want us to lose momentum. Momentum is a funny thing because you can't see it. We can learn from our mistakes such as initially not finishing the basement and we are now doing that. I thank God for everyone that has worked so hard. We are getting there. Leah and I will be very thankful when that is done. There is also that that has to get done and is the Lord calling us to build a building too. That is a real stretch—kind of like "you feed them." We are in a good time. There are young people and young adults doing stuff and wanting to come to church. It is a good time but we want to keep going. We want to keep our foot on the gas. There is more to do and it's kind of exhausting but sometimes the Lord is always stretching us. Be in prayer about all of it. It's like a shoebox. You don't want to be confined by your building. When God is moving—a building can be confining. I think we need to be on it. If the Lord says no, fine but when God is moving it is not always the most comfortable thing. With the staff thing that is a little scary but we need to move forward as that can blow more wind into the sail and move us forward. A lot of churches have negative challenges. We have positive challenges. We thank God for that. We may not be comfortable but I know we can do it. We went from 1 to 2 services and we did it and that wasn't comfortable and may the Lord bring 3 services. May the Lord bring more. If we aren't looking to be stretched and more.....the Lord has called us into wonderful things. The 5000 reminded me of this when the Lord said—you give them something to eat. They did it with the Lord's power. I believe there is way more that the Lord wants us to feed with this church. What is the Lord's dream cause His dream is usually way bigger.

Closing Prayer and Adjournment. The pastor prayed. Lucas thanked everyone for being here. Janet Marlett made a motion to adjourn. Matt Thayer seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting closed at 12:14 p.m.

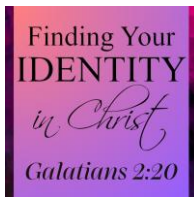

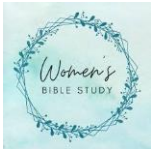
