

LEADERSHIP MEETING

Leadership Team Meeting November 13, 2023

Those present were Pastor Dan Pearson, Terry Silverberg, Brenda Cogbill, Lucas Carlson, Burt Beebe, Tim Jurisch, Scott Carnine, Josh Williamson, Susie Thayer, Mike Pickard and Cindee McBride.

The meeting was called to order by Lucas. Katie Jurisch shared that there is a need for additional space during service for children ages five to ten as the nursery is full as we continue to grow. Katie left after she shared about the need. Leadership team agreed to explore options and welcome any suggestions as God continues to bless United Covenant Church with growth.

Terry led in devotions focused on leadership. There are four O's: Opportunities, Opposition (which can be from the world, flesh or the devil), Obedience and Outcome. Terry shared from 1 Corinthians. Shared was the fact that we often equate a leading from God based on how easy things go but we don't often experience "easy." We should continue to ask God for wisdom in all things. Terry prayed.

The youth report was provided by Josh Williamson. Currently the youth are on a modified schedule due to holidays. Discussed was upcoming family caroling on December 13th and, weather permitting, a youth Christmas party December 20th. Josh shared that the church is looking ahead toward UNITE to obtain a pulse on who may desire to go. UNITE is scheduled to be in Bowling Green, OH. Also discussed a possible winter retreat. Josh shared that the Safe seminar was very insightful and helpful.

Financial Report was reviewed and accepted (motioned by Brenda, seconded by Mike).

Old Business: Building growth team reported that the two projects (adding additional parking and improved handicap parking along with overflow space in foyer) net \$4300 over budget which will come from the future planning/building fund (motioned by Mike and seconded by Burt).

Community Growth reported that the connection team is doing well. The team will present for consideration to be included in the 2024 funds to help facilitate connection of new and old by possibly adding some additional counter space, so resources are readily available to share. It was also stated that small groups were of interest according to the survey, but the team has put that on hold until next year.

The leadership team discussed possible having a stage two to continue work identified by the initial teams. The goal is to continue the good work started and to coordinate additional activities. Terry recommended that both the building and connections team present future needs that may have budget impact in time for the annual meeting.

New Business: Burt shared that there is a need for a speaker in the foyer and a need for an additional TV along with required cables. Mike moved and Terry seconded that this come from the music budget. Motion passed. If possible, this will be set up in time for dessert theater.

The annual meeting will be held January 21st. Budget meeting is scheduled for January 17th. Next leadership team meeting is scheduled for December 12th.

Brenda shared that she attended the Ridgeview Board meeting (representing the leadership team of UCCC).

The nominating committee will be seeking to present two people to fill spots on the leadership team as Mike Pickard and Scott Carnine will be completing their terms at the end of this year.

Terry reported that the mutual ministry committee will be having a meeting on the 28th.

Terry also shared that there is a church in Phoenix that is willing to share their security policy and procedures for free to help other churches. The leadership team agreed this should be pursued.

Pastor Dan brought forth that we have an opportunity to hear from Janelle Johnson. A possible date is December 9th. Pastor also reported that a team visiting crossroads church in Forest Lake and that was interesting.

Mike Pickard made a motion to adjourn. Cindee seconded. Lucas will provide devotions for the next meeting. Lucas closed the meeting in prayer.
