


COVENANT HIGHLIGHTS



LEADERSHIP MEETING

Leadership Team Meeting October 9, 2023

Present: Lucas Carlson, Mike Pickard, Brenda Cogbill, Pastor Dan Pearson, Terry Silverberg, Tim Jurisch, Josh Williamson, Burt Beebe and Doug Lemons.

Mike led devotions from Jeremiah 32--leadership by example-follow a leader with a Godly life, singleness of heart and action. The leadership team opened in prayer.

Doug Lemons shared, giving his background and understanding of security along with what our needs should look like as we continue to grow. Our main concerns are about the security of our congregation and our children per pastor Dan. Doug gave great insight about what a protocol could look like. He has a wealth of knowledge in security and various ways we can include our local EMS such as police, fire, safety and create a relationship with them as we establish committees. He will help us identify problems that may occur and to be prepared. He will help devise an action plan and safety committee There will be an overall message to let the congregation know this is being looked into and put in place. Josh will look into getting people certified for AED use and CPR.

Youth Report: Overall it's going very well. Youth are taking ownership for their faith walk. The youth are studying Road to Truth series, equipping youth for life and youth are very receptive. Youth worship team starting again this fall and underground church youth activity scheduled for October 21 with community churches participating. Prayer is needed for this event and the speaker will be Josh. Discussion held about youth having activities inside as weather demands and discussed where they will meet within the church. Moving the chandeliers that are in the foyer was discussed due to more youth activity.

Financial Reports were accepted.

Discussion held about the existing teams resulting from the survey and their actions that are being put in place. There will be a location for the extra chairs in the area where the library was as well as coat racks. The carpet has been ordered and will be installed later this month. There has been little interest in someone taking the lead or organizing a mission team. We hope to have that in place soon. Suggestions were discussed.

The nominating committee will be submitting names to be voted on to replace those that have fulfilled their years of service, Scott Carnine and Mike Pickard.

KICY radio station in Alaska is having their yearly fundraiser and it was motioned and passed to send \$200.00.

Pastor commented on the worship service Sunday evening October 8th stating how well the evening went. The church is looking to do more services like that in the future. The next leadership meeting will be November 13th.
