

## ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

### Annual Congregational Meeting January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2026

#### **Opening Scripture and Prayer.** Led by Emily Johnson.

James 1: 5: "If you need wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him." Ask with faith. Ephesians 4:1-2 "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love." Romans 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." Emily prayed.

**Call to Order.** Lucas called the meeting to order at 12:05 pm. 54 people were present. Lucas expressed his appreciation for everyone coming. Thank you for the leadership team. Looking forward to this meeting and being able to share what has happened and what is to come.

**Secretary Report.** A few minutes were provided to review the Semi-Annual Meeting Minutes from July 2025. Mitch Binsfeld motioned to accept as written. Matt Elsmore seconded. Motion passed with no objections.

**Financial Report.** A few minutes were provided to review. There was a Wednesday night budget meeting prior to the annual meeting. Katie Elmer moved to approve the financial reports. Gretchen Wallberg seconded the motion. Motion passed with none opposed.

**Board of Directors for United Covenant Foundation as listed in the annual report.** Lucas shared that the Covenant Foundation was formed which included a daycare and Ridgeview. The daycare has since dissolved. Our church is the sole member of the Foundation and so we elect members. Joel Markuson is the chair. Joel added that if you are not familiar with Ridgeview, come check it out--get on the list to live there. It is volunteer run, so we are always looking for help. Mike Pickard made a motion to accept Board Members as listed. Tim Jurisch Seconded. Motion passed with no objections.

**Leadership Team Highlights.** Highlights were presented by Lucas Carlson. Highlights included: 1) Lucas expressed appreciation to everyone. 2) We wanted to make our physical building more secure. We installed cameras. This is an ongoing effort and there are plans to continue to improve such as adding crash bars. Thank you, Doug Lemons, for leading this. 3) Matt Thayer is our missions coordinator and we have had a lot of young people doing outreach and missions and the generous support of the church. Please continue to pray. 4) Continuing to work toward policy and procedures in place as we grow as we move from being a small church to a larger church. We need policies for clear communication such as for the nursery and church van use. 5) we purchased property across the road 6) we moved the parsonage and we are close to having that part finished and we are really thankful for: the hours of work done there; for

the fellowship; and the financial savings that the volunteer work has brought forth. There is more to be done to finish the parsonage. Please feel free to reach out if you can help. 6) we sent a group on a Missions trip to NC to help clean up storm damage 7) there was a ministry fair this fall from which people signed up for volunteer work—there is always a need. There are still those plug-in forms at sign up central if you want to plug-in 8) Lucas was able to go through a free 6 week chairperson training through the Covenant church. Thank you that I was able to go through that training. 9) KICY came to share their mission as we hosted a Salmon dinner and 10) Thank you Brenda for serving these last 3 years and Matt for filling in for Terry's spot. We are excited to welcome Sarah Enslin and Nate Cundiff to be new LT members. Again, Lucas thanked everyone for the opportunity to lead.

**Building Team Update:** Tim Jurisch presented. I am honored to fill in for Terry. We have done a lot of upgrades to the house such as 9-foot ceiling in basement, floor drain, new garage door, floor heat in garage and basement, new furnace and re-modeled the upstairs a little bit such as moving the laundry upstairs. Currently our budget is doing well. We are around 180K spent so that puts us \$50K under budget which is amazing. There is still a lot of work to do such as siding work. We hired someone to finish the drywall.

#### **Other Reports:**

**Missions Team:** Matt Thayer presented. We currently support 4 mission groups: CRU, REI, KICY, and Congo (semi-retired). We decided as a LT team that as the Congo person states he is semi-retired and financially fine, but we would pick up 2 new organizations: Seth and Samantha Jordan in Jerusalem and Kyle Montgomery in Jordan through Overland Missions. Continue to support all in prayer. We did have the mission trip last March to NC. There were 21 that went. Matt shared a story about his boys and how much they enjoyed the trip. If you are thinking of going on one, Matt strongly encourages you to do so. The next one is targeted for 2027. We can do a smaller one if there is interest, but the next church one is planned in 2027.

**Ushers Report:** Highlighted by Lucas. See page 10 of the Annual Report. I am so thankful that the church continues to grow.

**Youth Report:** by Josh Williamson. Thank you to the youth leaders on Wednesday nights. They have been Jim and Cindy Mohrland, Drew Krech, Elise Simpson, Tam Elsmore, Gretchen Wallberg, Mitch and Misty Binsfeld, and Carter Wallberg. Thank you to Burt and Doug faithfully helping with sound. Our youth group is so special. They are so unique. It is amazing how they stick out and pay attention when we go to events. Last week with listened to an hour-long sermon—we had the attention of almost all students for the whole time that is amazing. Our kids are digging deep into challenging topics. We are diving into scripture and standing firm on scripture. We are standing strong on truth. It

is a testament to parents and the church. Thank you so much.

**Open to Floor:** Kent shared his appreciation of Tim and LT in filling the gap left by Terry. It is just amazing.

**Motion to approve both printed and verbal reports** made by Kent Ansell and Mitch Binsfeld seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

**Leadership Team Affirmation:** Margaret Peterson motioned and Misty Binsfeld seconded. Motion carried.

**Approve the 2026 Budget:** Thank you to those who came to the Wednesday pre-meeting for the budget. Bonnie Eastvold moved to approve. Janet Marlett seconded. Motion carried.

**Delegate Selection:** Lucas shared that if anyone feels led to go to the NW Conference in Willmar or the EV Covenant annual meeting in AZ in June as well as LBBC to please pray about going and talk with Lucas or Pastor Dan if you feel God leading you to go.

**Old Business:** 1) added a missionary to budget 2) proud to send out youth 3) Luann Binsfeld stepped in to help us maintain our current building...if you are looking to plug in and you have the skill, please let her know or Lucas know so we can be good stewards of our current building. 4) spending under budget for 2025, the income was less than what we were hoping for---I am sharing this because we are getting to our future planning. We have put \$5K into our budget for future building. This last year we added \$3K for future staff cause as we grow as there is a strain on the current staff. Maintaining those 2 lines are causing us to be upside down in our budget. We are currently trying to move forward as a LT as to what is our priority—we really want to add on as evidence by the over utilization of space on Wednesday night. We also see the need for more pastoral staff—administration and small groups so as a LT our focus is going to be to come up with a job description, pay and benefits package that would be fair and match the budget as well as wanting to move forward with the building focus knowing we can't start that immediately. If we are blessed with increased giving, we don't have to start over with either goal—meaning we will be ready when God says "go." We want to be careful—we want to stay in step with what God is doing—neither jumping ahead nor lagging behind His plan.

**New Business.** We will continue to focus on missions and trying to follow God.

*Opened to floor:*

- Kevin Marlett...is the building plan in stone as to what we are going to do? Answer: no, nothing is in stone. We started with a loose sketch, and it got paused when we focused on the parsonage. There is nothing in stone. We are doing our best to prepare.
- Lucas: Thank you to Tim J for his leadership on the building team. As a LT, we are not going to make an official motion, but we may move into finishing the basement as we are under budget from what was approved.

- Julie Hilton: Is the focus going forward to get back to one service?

Answer: in a perfect world that would be amazing. That is a really hard question to answer when we don't know the future. Our church is so good at fellowship.

**Pastors Comments.** Thank you for Brenda and Matt. Thank you to Nate and Sarah for stepping up. Pastor prayed for Nate and Sarah. As we know, our friend Terry passed away suddenly and that was hard. Tim has done a beautiful job with the building. Thank you. As we move forward, we are in a challenging time. Thank you for being here. It is really hard going from smaller church to larger church cause its hard because that sweet spot fellow ship is hard—a lot of churches fail at said transition. When a worship center gets 80% full it's hard to grow beyond that—people might not come back so we have to make space and it's not comfortable. Change is really hard and exciting at the same time. We have to be willing to grow and say that we are about the Kingdom and not about us but about reaching the world for Christ. We want to say thank you Jesus for His grace. We are so blessed and honored that people will come. As we go forward, we have to have an open hand to follow wherever God leads up. We want more so it's crunch time. It's hard cause there is a sense of loss. With the building, it is an issue, so what are we going to do? We need to ask the Lord what is that going to look like. If God continues to grow, it's not if it is when. With staff, it is very different from when I was at a small church. I start looking at Josh and I see him as an associate pastor. He is an amazing youth pastor. If the Lord leads and he steps into more of an administrative role we need to be more open. As we say Lord we want more, not to build our Kingdom but because we live in a dark world where people are being crazy.

Bill West—as you and Josh might be maxing out, are there other things volunteers can pick up? As an encouragement—are there ways in which we can help? Can we help regarding money?

Pastor says this about money—if you don't designate, it really helps us as a LT. We don't know everything that is next, but the Lord does.

We were just in HI, and we went to this really cool church in Kona. Their building was not as big as ours and they have 1500 people. They use tents. I was inspired by that. Let us always have the attitude of moving forward and we need to finish A before going to step B. I will end with God is good and Romans 12: 9. Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good...ended with do all that you can to live in peace with everyone.

**Pastor closed in prayer.**

**Addendum.** Lucas has the auditor's statement that didn't make it into the book.

**Adjournment:** Mike Pickard made a motion to adjourn. Bonnie Eastvold seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 1:03 p.m.

Tim J inquired via Cary if the damage during the move would be covered by our insurance. Susie called the insurance company to let them know that the house was moved. They must send

the information to the underwriters to determine if they can just change the address or if they have to start over. Susie is waiting to hear. Do we have/need liability on other parcels of land? We also have a window at church that is shattered/cracked. Cary will follow-up.




#### MISSION STITCHERS
